May 20, 2024, RICHMOND, VA - Governor Glenn Youngkin has announced a new initiative, Virginia Invests, which will be led by **Virginia Innovation Partnership Corporation (VIPC)** that expands investment and growth opportunities for Virginia-based, innovation-driven startups and entrepreneurial ecosystems throughout the Commonwealth. Leveraging previous Virginia-awarded federal funding from the U.S. Department of Treasury, under its SSBCI Equity/Venture Capital Program, VIPC's Virginia Invests launches new investment partnerships with an initial selection of seven diverse first-time and emerging fund managers that are expected to catalyze and attract \$250 million of investment into over 100 high-growth Virginia startups during the next 3-5 years via private sector fund match and co-investment. 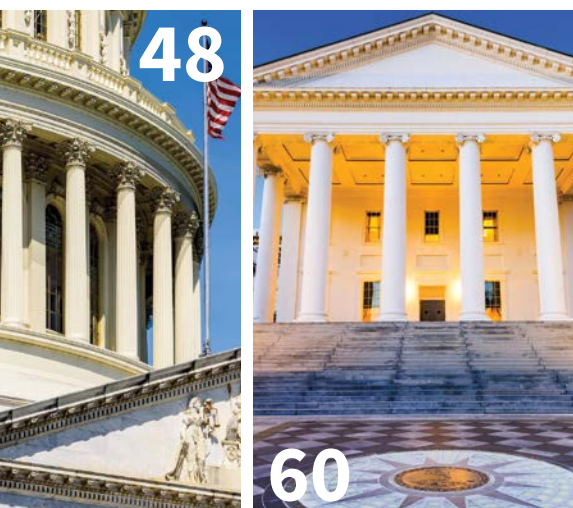

Virginia: Open for Business

The Virginia Handbook for Success has been created to assist all small businesses, startups, entrepreneurs, and innovators in the Commonwealth and accelerate their growth and success. If you describe yourself or your company using one of these terms, defined below, the opportunities captured within this guide are for you!

Additionally, in order to make this handbook a more effective tool, you will see colored identifiers alongside specific opportunities that may have a targeted focus in order to help narrow down and classify those that may be of particular interest to you. You may identify with one or more

of these categories. Remember, though, even if a resource or opportunity has been designated for a specific group, it may also be available to the broad small business, startup, entrepreneur, and/or innovator community. Be sure to explore each opportunity of interest to find those best suited for you.

Resources and opportunities within Virginia are constantly evolving, so the digital version of the Handbook will be periodically updated. If you have a resource or opportunity not currently captured within the guide and wish to be included in future editions or if you need to update your information, please email info@VirginiaPC.org.

Small Business

According to the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), an independent, for-profit business is generally considered a “small business” when it has fewer than 500 employees. Different industry sectors, however, may have different size standards set by the SBA that would qualify the small business for access to specific federal resources. For more information on Virginia’s definition of a minority-owned business, visit sbsd.virginia.gov/certification-division/faqs.

Innovator

An innovator is a person who develops new ideas, products, and/or services, typically ones that have the potential to disrupt the status quo.

Startup

Startups are a type of small business. They are young companies founded to develop a unique product or service and introduce it to market. Startups are often marked by rapid innovation, development, and growth, and they rely on funding from the founder(s), family members, friends, and angel investors, especially in the earliest stages.

Entrepreneur

An entrepreneur is someone with an idea who starts a business. Entrepreneurs shoulder most of the financial and other risks that come with starting a new venture, but, in turn, reap most of the rewards.

Minority-Owned Business Opportunities

Some resources identified in this handbook may only or especially pertain to minority-owned businesses. To emphasize opportunities for these businesses and founders, this identifier may be included on applicable listings. 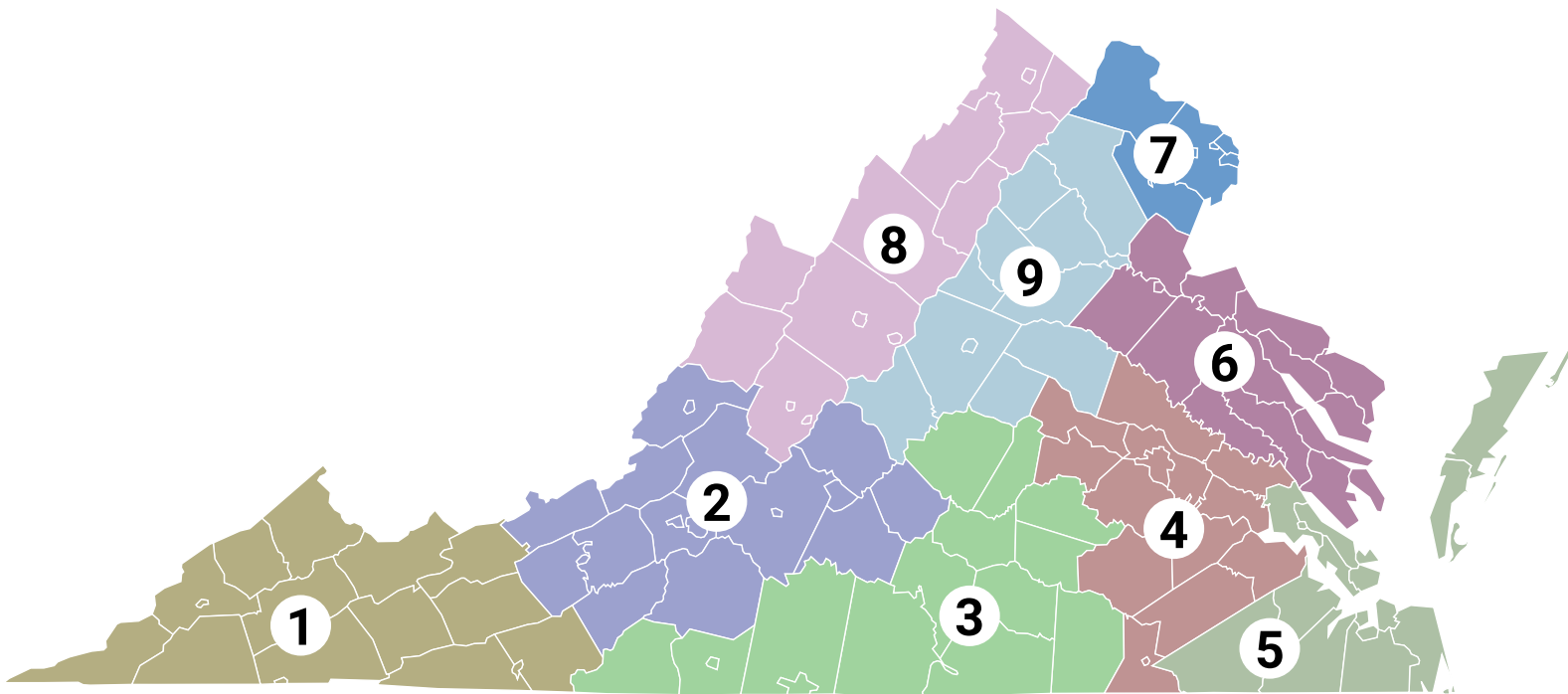

GO Virginia

Go Virginia is a statewide initiative that is changing the way Virginia's regions collaborate on private sector growth and workforce development activities in order to diversify and strengthen the economy in every region of the Commonwealth. GO Virginia supports programs to create more high-paying jobs through incentivized collaboration between business, education, and government. For more information, visit govirginia.org. The map below identifies the nine GO Virginia regions.

Region 1

Includes the counties of Bland, Buchanan, Carroll, Dickenson, Grayson, Lee, Russell, Scott, Smyth, Tazewell, Washington, Wise, and Wythe, and the cities of Bristol, Galax, and Norton.

Region 2

Includes the counties of Alleghany, Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford, Botetourt, Campbell, Craig, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Montgomery, Pulaski, and Roanoke, and the cities of Covington, Lynchburg, Radford, Roanoke, and Salem.

Region 3

Includes the counties of Amelia, Brunswick, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Halifax, Henry, Lunenburg, Mecklenburg, Nottoway, Patrick, Pittsylvania, and Prince Edward, and the cities of Danville and Martinsville.

Region 4

Includes the counties of Charles City, Chesterfield, Dinwiddie, Goochland, Greenville, Hanover, Henrico, New Kent, Powhatan, Prince George, Surry, and Sussex, and the cities of Colonial Heights, Emporia, Hopewell, Petersburg, and Richmond.

Region 5

Includes the counties of Accomack, Isle of Wight, James City, Northampton, Southampton, and York, and the cities of Chesapeake, Franklin, Hampton, Newport News, Poquoson, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Virginia Beach, and Williamsburg.

Region 6

Includes the counties of Caroline, Essex, Gloucester, King and Queen, King George, King William, Lancaster, Mathews, Middlesex, Northumberland, Richmond, Spotsylvania, Stafford, and Westmoreland, and the city of Fredericksburg.

Region 7

Includes the counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William, and the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Manassas, and Manassas Park.

Region 8

Includes the counties of Augusta, Bath, Clarke, Frederick, Highland, Page, Rockbridge, Rockingham, Shenandoah, and Warren, and the cities of Buena Vista, Harrisonburg, Lexington, Staunton, Waynesboro, and Winchester.

Region 9

Includes the counties of Albemarle, Culpeper, Fauquier, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, Madison, Nelson, Orange, and Rappahannock, and the city of Charlottesville.

Calculate Your Startup Costs

Your business plan will help you figure out how much money it will take to start your business. Calculating the startup costs is important so that you can request funding, attract investors, and estimate when you'll turn a profit. You'll face different startup expenses depending on your business type. This [fillable PDF spreadsheet](#) can help you calculate your small business startup costs, while this [break-even analysis calculator](#) can help you discover your break-even point and determine your future profits. Funding Your Business

It costs money to start a business. How to fund your business is one of the first—and most important—financial choices most business owners make, and could affect how you structure and run your business. Every business has different needs, and no financial solution is one-size-fits-all. Potential sources of business funding are self-funding (or bootstrapping), grants, venture capital investment, crowdfunding, and small business loans. It is also important to establish business credit. Existing businesses have the advantage of an established financial history, but loan eligibility for a new business is typically based on its owner's personal credit score. That's why cultivating and maintaining good credit scores—for both your personal and business lines of credit—are so important. Poor credit history is one of the main reasons loan applications for small businesses are often declined and can also impact insurance rates and the attractiveness of your business to potential partners, suppliers, and vendors. Pick Your Business Location

Your business location is another one of the most important decisions you'll make. Your business location determines the taxes, zoning laws, and regulations your business will be subject to, regardless of whether you're setting up a brick-and-mortar business or launching an online store. Where you choose to locate your business depends in part on the location of your target market, business partners, and your personal preferences. In addition, you should consider the costs, benefits, and restrictions of different government agencies. Once you've selected a business location, you'll need to register it, pay taxes, and get the necessary licenses and permits. Locating your business in Virginia offers a foundation for success. With a premier talent base, diverse industries, thriving quality of life and livability, advantageous location and infrastructure, and strong business climate, among other notable qualities, Virginia is consistently ranked as a top state for business in the U.S. Compare Virginia to other states at data.vedp.org/compare/compareva and find the right location for your business using Virginia site location tools at sites.vedp.org/virginia.

Choose Your Business Structure

The business structure you choose influences everything, from day-to-day operations to taxes and how much of your personal assets are at risk. You should choose a business structure that gives you the right balance of legal protections and benefits. Consulting with business counselors, attorneys, and accountants can prove helpful. You'll need to choose a business structure before you register your business with the state. Common business structures include sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company (LLC), and corporation, which could take the form of a C corp, S corp, benefit corporation, nonprofit corporation, or cooperative. Choose Your Business Name

It's not easy to pick the perfect name, but you can do so with a little creativity and market research. You'll want one that reflects your brand and captures your spirit. You'll also want to make sure your business name isn't already being used by someone else. In Virginia, you can do this through the State Corporation Commission (SCC): scc.virginia.gov/pages/new-business-resources. Learn more about choosing your business name at sba.gov/business-guide/launch-your-business/choose-your-business-name.

Register Your Business

Once you've selected a business name, location, and structure, you need to register it to make it a distinct legal entity and be eligible for personal liability protection, legal benefits, and tax benefits.

For most small businesses, registering your business is as simple as registering your business name with state and local governments. If your business is a limited liability company (LLC), corporation, partnership, or nonprofit corporation,

you'll probably need to register with any state where you conduct business activities. Typically, you're considered to be conducting business activities in a state when:

- Your business has a physical presence in the state
- You often have in-person meetings with clients in the state
- A significant portion of your company's revenue comes from the state
- Any of your employees work in the state

In Virginia, businesses are registered through the State Corporation Commission (SCC). The SCC website provides step-by-step guidance on this process and more and is another useful resource for businesses. Learn more at scc.virginia.gov/pages/new-business-resources. You will also want to register your business through the Virginia Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity (SBSD)'s Business One Stop at bos.sbsd.virginia.gov. Business One Stop provides aspiring entrepreneurs and business owners in Virginia with a single, central place for resources for their business.

Typically, you don't need to register with county or city governments to actually form your business. Local governments determine registration, licensing, and permitting requirements, so visit local government websites to find out what you need to do.

Get Federal & State Tax ID Numbers

Your **federal** tax ID number—also known as an Employer Identification Number (EIN)—works like a personal social security number, but for your business. It lets your small business open a bank account, apply for business licenses and permits, and pay state and federal taxes. It's free to apply for an EIN, and you should do it right after you register your business. The need for a **state** tax ID number ties directly to whether your business must pay state taxes. The process to get a state tax ID number is similar to getting an EIN, but it will vary by state. In Virginia, small businesses should consult the Virginia Department of Taxation at tax.virginia.gov/businesses. Apply for Licenses & Permits

Keep your business running smoothly by staying legally compliant. The licenses and permits you need for your business will vary by industry, location, business activities, government rules, and other factors. Most small businesses need a combination of licenses and permits from both federal and state agencies. Business activities regulated by a federal agency will need a federal license or permit. Requirements and fees depend on your business activity and the issuing agency. Check with them for details on the business license cost. The licenses and permits you need from the state, county, or city will depend on your business activities and business location. States tend to regulate a broader range of activities than the federal government, and industry options often vary by state. In Virginia, visit dpor.virginia.gov/applicants and/or sbsd.virginia.gov/business-development-and-outreach/lgc to

Open a Business Bank Account

Small business bank accounts can help you handle legal, tax, and day-to-day issues and offer perks that don't come with a standard personal bank account. You should open a business account when you're ready to start accepting or spending money as your business and once you have received your federal Employer Identification Number (EIN). Opening a business bank account is easy once you've picked your bank. Simply go online or visit a local branch to begin the process. Get Business Insurance

Business insurance protects you from the unexpected costs of running a business. Accidents, natural disasters, and lawsuits could run you out of business if you're not appropriately protected. The federal government requires every business with employees to have workers' compensation, unemployment, and disability insurance. Some states also require additional insurance. Consult the Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC) to learn more about commercial insurance: [scc.virginia.gov/pages/commercial-insurance-\(1\)](https://scc.virginia.gov/pages/commercial-insurance-(1)).

Your Elevator Pitch

An elevator pitch is a brief (think 30-60 seconds, or the time it takes to ride an elevator) introduction to your business. Elevator pitches are regularly used to attract investors, promote a product, or advertise a business. Your elevator pitch should capture the attention of your audience, pique their interest, and facilitate an opportunity for future connection, but you're not looking to convey your entire business strategy or all your selling points. Think of the "three C's" when preparing your elevator pitch: **clear**—can be understood by a layman; **compelling**—the problem your business solves, the value it brings to your audience, and what sets you apart from others; and **credible**—what makes you qualified to do what you do. A good elevator pitch will end with a call to action, such as connecting on LinkedIn, exchanging contact information, or scheduling a time to chat further. Need models of successful elevator pitches or templates to craft your own? A quick Google search will yield many examples to help you in this process.

Building Your Network

The most effective way to grow a business is by building a strong business network. A business network can help generate leads, facilitate contacts that can lead to partnerships or referrals, keep you informed about industry trends, and give you a competitive edge. Relationships aren't developed in a day, but there are several strategies you can engage to begin building your professional network, such as leveraging social media, attending industry events and networking functions, getting involved in organizations related to your field, and offering your expertise by writing articles, giving presentations, teaching classes, or other ways to share your knowledge with others.

State, Regional, & Local Resources | Accessing Capital

The Commonwealth of Virginia offers numerous funding opportunities to support and grow your business. A collection of these opportunities follows, categorized by type of funding.

Grant Funding

A grant is a competitive monetary award given to a qualifying business and generally used to support a specific set of objectives during a finite time frame. Unlike other types of financial assistance, grants do not need to be paid back. Each grant opportunity has tailored eligibility criteria, application requirements and processes, timelines, and terms, all of which should be consulted before pursuing funding to ensure the grant is a fit for your business.

A brief Google search will uncover many helpful tips about preparing successful grant applications. You may wish to

Commonwealth Commercialization Fund (CCF)

The Commonwealth Commercialization Fund, or CCF, is a state-funded competitive grant program administered by the Virginia Innovation Partnership Corporation (VIPC). CCF supports Virginia's small business community and its colleges, universities, and nonprofit research institutes at the earliest stages of their entrepreneurial and/or commercialization journeys. CCF seeks innovative technologies with a high potential for economic development and job creation that position the Commonwealth as a national leader in science- and technology-based research, development, and commercialization. Commonwealth Health Research Board (CHRB)

The Commonwealth Health Research Board, or CHRB, was established via legislation to promote and protect the health of citizens of the Commonwealth. CHRB awards grants to state agencies, institutions of higher education, and nonprofit organizations in Virginia for research projects that demonstrate the potential to maximize human health benefits for Virginians. Fairfax Founders Fund (FFF)

The Fairfax Founders Fund, or FFF, is a grant and technical assistance program that provides grants of up to \$50,000 to early-stage Fairfax County-based startups on a high-growth trajectory. For more information, visit fairfaxcounty.gov/economic-initiatives/fairfax-founders-fund.

Small Business Investment Grant Fund (SBIG)

The Small Business Investment Grant Fund, or SBIG, incentivizes investors to inject capital into Virginia's small businesses by offering them an opportunity to receive a cash return on their investment of up to \$50,000. The SBIG is administered by the Virginia Small Business Financing Authority (VSBFA). Although the program is not currently active, more information on the SBIG can be found via sbsd.virginia.gov/virginia-small-business-financing-authority.

Virginia Catalyst

The Virginia Catalyst provides competitive grants to Virginia's biosciences community. These grants, ranging from \$200,000 to \$800,000, address major unmet needs for improving human health, support critical commercialization-related objectives, and help to advance Virginia's economy. The Virginia Catalyst encourages collaborative partnerships between Virginia universities and industry. For more information, visit virginiacatalyst.org.

Loan Funding

Bridging Virginia

Bridging Virginia is a nonprofit community development loan fund that provides access to affordable capital and technical assistance for historically marginalized small businesses in the Greater Richmond region. For more information, visit bridgingvirginia.com.

Business Finance Center (BFC)

The Business Finance Center, or BFC, is an initiative of the Community Business Partnership (CBP) to deploy much-needed capital to underserved entrepreneurs and business

owners in the Northern Virginia region. Since its inception, the BFC has funded small and emerging businesses that were unable to obtain financing due to credit or other limitations. For more information, visit cbponline.org/financing.

Business Seed Capital, Inc.

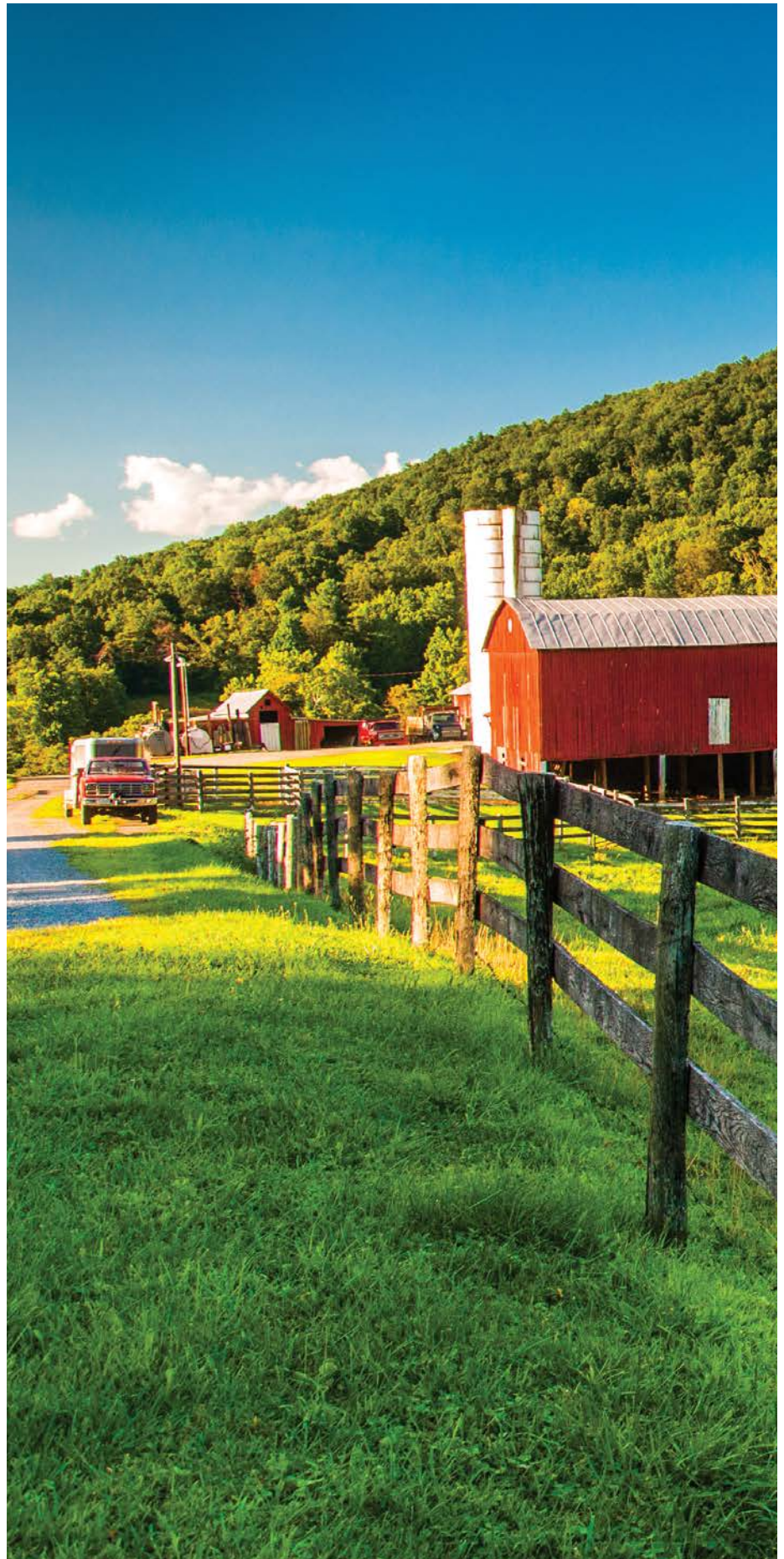

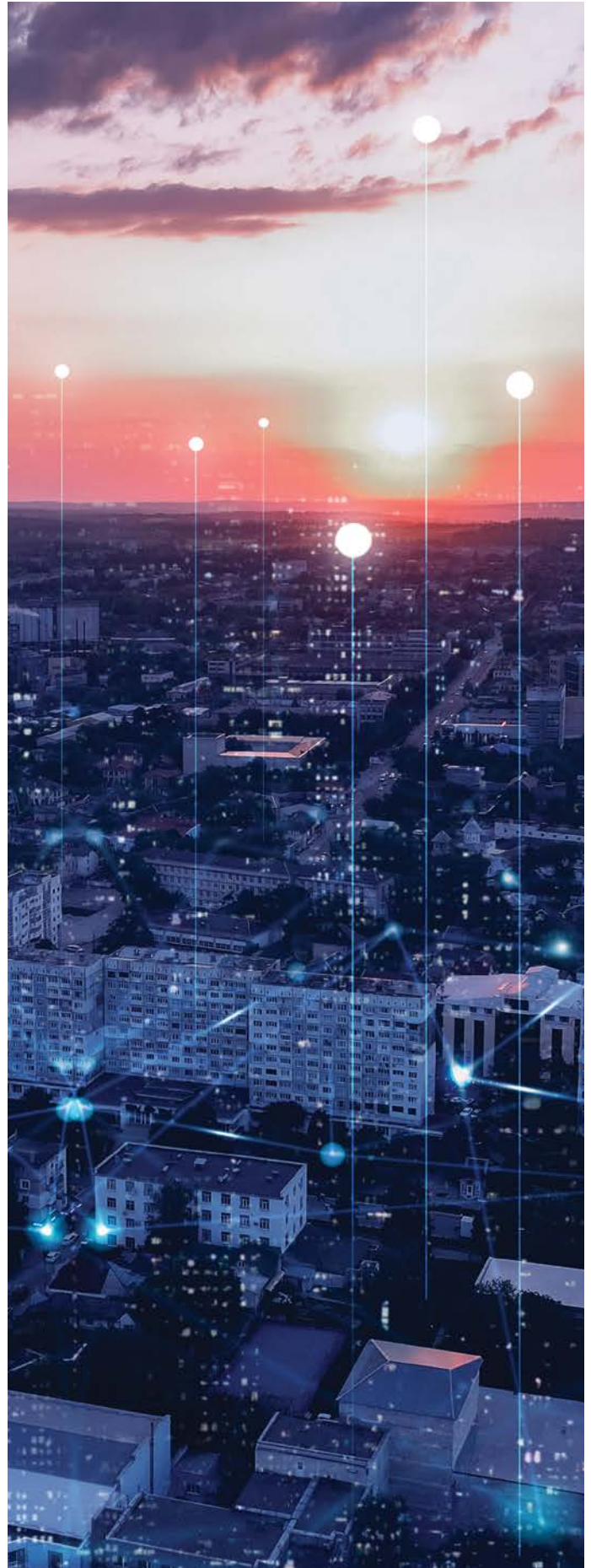

SBIR / STTR Funding & Training

SBIR & STTR Grant Programs

The federal SBIR (Small Business Innovation Research) and STTR (Small Business Technology Transfer) grant programs are the principal U.S. government-sponsored funding vehicles for early-stage technology companies in Virginia and around the country. These highly competitive programs are designed to stimulate technological innovation and provide opportunities for small businesses, especially related to high-risk, early-stage R&D projects that are typically not ready for support by venture capital firms or angel investors. More than \$2.5 billion is available each year through these programs, with individual grants ranging from \$150,000 to \$1.5 million. Virginia ranks 3rd in the U.S. in SBIR and STTR awards, with over \$130 million in grant funding in 2017. SBIR grants are designed to support startups operating on their own, while STTR grants support startups collaborating with university-affiliated researchers. Your Business is Growing—Now What?

The Commonwealth of Virginia can help you navigate business growth.

Manage Your Finances

Proper accounting keeps your business running smoothly. It's important to maintain appropriate bookkeeping and have a basic knowledge of business finances, such as creating a balance sheet and deciding on a method for recording purchases. A balance sheet helps you account for costs like employees and supplies; track assets, liabilities, and equity; and provide a cash flow projection for future years. When it comes to recording purchases, businesses often use either the accrual or cash methods. The accrual method puts transactions on the books immediately upon completing the sale, while the cash method only records this once payment has been received. Ultimately you may decide to seek assistance with your accounting tasks by hiring a certified public accountant (CPA), bookkeeper, or using an online service. Hire & Manage Employees

As your business begins to grow, you may need to hire a team to meet demands and keep operations running smoothly. Before finding the right person or people for the job, you'll need to determine the type of worker you need—an independent contractor or an employee—and create a plan for paying them. If your approach is to hire employees, you'll need to consider healthcare and other benefits to attract and retain the right kind of talent and ensure your business adheres to federal and state labor laws. Marketing & Sales

The business plan you previously developed should contain the central elements of your marketing strategy. However, you should also develop—and evaluate at least annually—a

marketing plan, which turns your strategy into action by describing the steps you'll take to persuade potential customers to buy your products or services. Your marketing plan should address your target market, competitive advantage, sales plan, marketing and sales goals, action plan, and marketing budget. In order to evaluate whether your marketing plan is working, be prepared to measure the return on investment (ROI) that your marketing and sales generate. Secure More Funding

Once your business is up and running, you may need more capital to sustain it. Funding sources available to established yet growing businesses are the same as those available to startups, such as grants, loans, credit, crowdfunding, and capital investment. You may discover that now, however, you may need to demonstrate your business is doing well and has had growth in order to access additional funds. Expand to New Locations

Expanding your business to a new state, county, or city isn't very different from opening a brand new business there. Just as you did when you first set up your business, you'll want to make sure you register it with the right agencies and pay the appropriate taxes in the new location. Before you make any moves, though, you'll want to update your marketing

plan with your new location in mind. Think about your target customer, sales plan, and competitive advantage. Next, confirm that your business is financially prepared. Build a forecast that projects estimated costs and revenue for the new location and review your balance sheet to ensure you can cover the costs of expanding. Become a Federal Contractor

The U.S. government is the world's largest customer. It buys all types of products and services and is required by law to provide opportunities for small businesses. In fact, they try to award a significant percentage of all federal contracts to small businesses, with a certain percentage to women-owned, minority-owned, and service-disabled Veteran-owned small businesses and HUBZone program participants. There are two broad categories of government contractors: prime contractors, who bid on and win contracts directly from government agencies, and subcontractors, who join prime contractor teams to provide a specific capability or product. To be eligible to serve as a prime contractor or subcontractor, you need to register your business with the System for Award Management (SAM) at sam.gov and obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI). You must also make sure you legally qualify as a small business, including meeting size requirements.
